Moderate Social Distancing

All procedures and policies in Plan A will be in place.

Additional Procedures:

Social Distancing Protocols

-Students will remain 6 feet apart, especially when students are stationary

Transportation

- 1 student per seat, with consideration for family members

The upper building can accommodate 12 students per classroom and remain 6 feet apart. The lower building classrooms can accommodate up to 15 students per room and still remain 6 feet apart.

Students will be assigned either A Day or B Day. A Day students will attend in class on Monday and Wednesday, while the other half of the class (B Day students) will do remote learning. B Day students will attend Tuesday and Thursday, while the other half of the class (A Day students) will participate in remote learning.

Parental input and space availability will be used to determine students for A Day and B Day assignment. Individual student needs will also be weighed when making decisions for placement.

Teachers will have coverage for their class for 1 hour a day in order to remotely teach the students who are not physically in class that day.

Students who are selected to participate in full remote learning for the beginning of the school year will be assigned a classroom and will participate with the other remote learning students for each day of the week. Paper packets can be picked up and dropped off on Fridays. Work during the week can be scanned or taken a picture of to turn in to teachers. Work can also be turned in using online resources, i.e. Google Classroom or enVision Math. Full Remote learners must continue to make academic progress in order to stay in the remote setting. Full remote students who do not participate in remote learning will be marked as unexcused absences. Excessive unexcused absences will be reported to the Department of Social Services as a truancy case.
