Exploring the Great Artists Ages 8-11

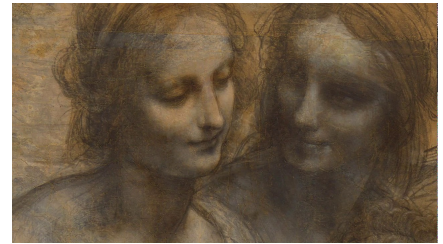
When: Monday March 9th to Thursday March 12th or Monday March 16th to Thursday March 19th

Fee: \$135 The camp includes 10 hours of instruction, and use of all materials including, graphite and colored pencils, oil pastels, paper, and liquid watercolors

Historical artists, as well as a variety of art techniques will be explored in this four-day workshop. Each day, students will learn about a different artist in history who developed a unique style and technique, which revolutionized the art world during their time. They will gain an understanding of these techniques, and create artworks inspired by these artists.

Day 1: Students will learn about Leonardo Da Vinci and how he used the technique called “chiaroscuro,” in his drawings and paintings to create the look of three dimension. Using a variety of graphite pencils students will learn how to draw geometric forms and an animal. They will learn how to create a range of values and the look of three dimension using these materials in their drawings.



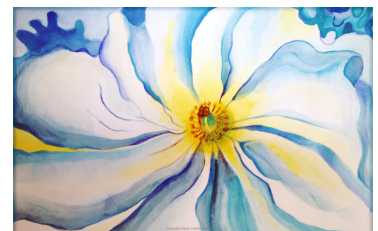
Day 2: Students will learn about the Art movement of Abstract Expressionism, and the artists Wassily Kandinsky and Jackson Pollock. Using colored pencils, permanent marker, and watercolors, students will create their own Kandinsky inspired artwork.



Day 3: Students will learn about Post-French Impressionist artist, Georges Seurat, who invented the technique of pointillism. Students will gain an understanding of how to create a sense of three dimension as they create their own pointillism painting using liquid watercolors.



Day 4: Students will learn about the life and art of American artist, Georgia O’Keeffe. Using oil pastels and watercolors, they will create dramatic, close up images of flowers. They will gain an understanding of how to create a range of values with the pastels, and learn different techniques to create shading and visual texture.
